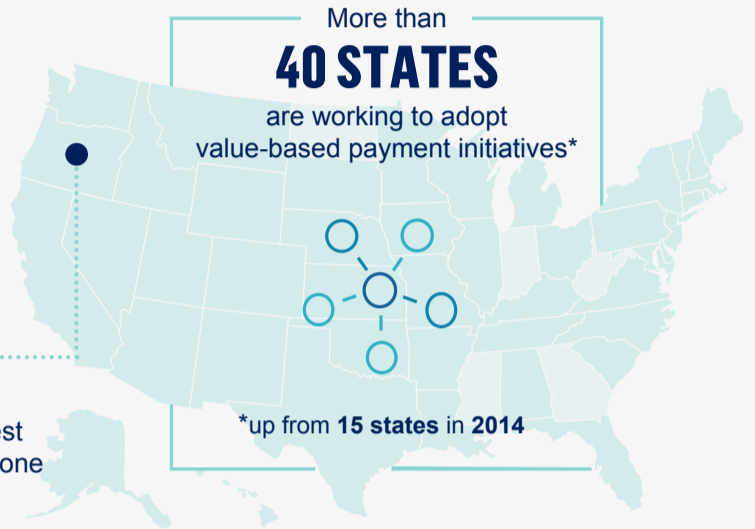
WHAT IS VALUE-BASED CARE (VBC)?



A health care delivery model in which providers are rewarded for quality health outcomes rather than the quantity of care delivered, with the triple aim of better care for individuals and improved population health at lower cost.

WHY DOES THIS MATTER?

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) prioritized VBC to improve outcomes & reduce costs in hopes of moving 50% of Medicare contracts to VBC by 2018



HOW IT WORKS IN OREGON



We partnered with **Advantage Dental**, the largest accountable care organization in the state, with one goal in mind - **improving oral health for all.**

HOW WE SUCCEEDED

PREVENTIVE CARE



85% of Advantage Dental services provided to children in 2015 were preventive or diagnostic:

- Routine exams
- Bitewing X-rays
- Cleaning
- Fluoride varnish

Compared to only

77% in the national sample of Medicaid-enrolled children

Caries Prevention

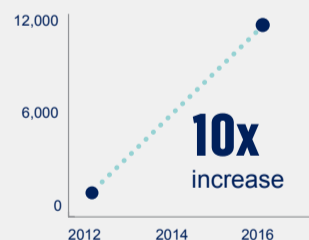

EXPANDED CARE IN THE COMMUNITY

In 2012, only **1,042 children** ages 20 and under received dental care outside of a dental office.

By 2016, that number increased to **11,160 patients.**

ADVANTAGE DENTAL

CHILDREN'S COSTS DECREASED BY 10%

and

ADULT COSTS DECREASED BY 6%

Median spent per patient per year
2013-2015

CHILDREN'S COSTS INCREASED BY 41%

and

ADULT COSTS INCREASED BY 8%
